General Information

702 million people around the world still live below the poverty line, mostly in sub-Saharan Africa. For this reason, Ugandan Lambs Association USA is devotedly supporting the Sustainable Development Goals set by the United Nations for 2030. This is done in a safe and nurturing environment to facilitate, monitor their education and promote their physical and spiritual well-being. The main purpose of supporting the children is to break the cycle of poverty and dependence in order to allow each child to fulfill his or her God-given potential. Primary seven results released

During the month, primary seven results were released for pupils who sat for Primary Leaving Exams. Ugandan Lambs Association had two of the Lambs who sat for their Primary Leaving Exams and they were Saida Nanyanzi who scored 21 aggregates in division 2 while Ssekyanzi Joel scored 32 aggregates in division 4. Both children were studying at St. Kizito Junior Primary school and will both join secondary school soon, even though their results were not very good.

Caring for sick children

One of the core values of Ugandan Lambs USA is caring for sick children as a way of meeting their physical needs. A paramount objective of all Ugandan Lambs Association USA's programs is addressing health vulnerabilities by improving access to quality health services, disease prevention and psychosocial counseling in a bid to enable the Lambs have good health, which is a precondition for living a life of dignity. During the month three of the Lambs were sick: Nsubuga Emmanel had a toothache, Nalumansi Magdalene had stomachache and stomach ulcers while Saul Galabuzi had eye problems. The children were taken to Tendo medical center for treatment and are fine except for Saul who still has eye problems, but he will also be fine.

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
