Introduction

Ugandan Lambs Association USA is a not-for-profit organization that supports orphans and vulnerable children. The support of children is done through sponsorship and donations. Nurturing supported children is priority and it is managed through them attending Child Evangelistic Fellowships, ensuring that they have basic needs - food, shelter, clothing, medical care and quality education. This is done in a safe and nurturing environment to facilitate and monitor their education and promote their physical and spiritual well-being. The main purpose of supporting the children is to break the cycle of poverty and dependence in a bid to allow each child to fulfill his or her God-given potential. Support that is rendered is much appreciated by supported children and their guardians.

1. Caring for sick children

One of the core values of Ugandan Lambs Association USA, is caring for sick children as a way to meet the physical needs of the children being cared for. During the month two of the Lambs fell sick: Nsubuga Emmanuel had malaria and cough, Mukisa Geoffrey had ulcers and malaria; they were both taken to Tendo Medical Clinic for treatment. They are now both ok and are doing well.

2. Collecting of children from school

During the month all children were collected from school and different institutions and universities and taken back to the homes. This was due to the fact that there was an outbreak of COVID 19 virus in the country where seven people had been reported to be infected by the virus. Therefore, in order to keep all children safe from catching the virus the Government of Uganda decided that they should all go back to their different homes for a month until the situation is arrested. The supported children were hence collected and taken to homes of Kayunga and Namugongo and they are being taken care of by the housemothers.

3. Effect of COVID 19

During the month activities of Ugandan Lambs Association were affected due to COVID 19 virus. This is because the Government of Uganda issued a directive where everyone has to be under lockdown until the situation is arrested. This has affected the operations of Ugandan Lambs Association USA. The children are however in safe hands where they are with the housemothers.

4. Guidance and counselling

During the month, guidance and counselling was offered to the supported children. This was done when they were being picked from school. They were advised to avoid being in crowded places since through such places

they can contract the COVID 19 virus. They were advised to wash their hands more often in order to avoid catching the virus. They were advised to read their books so that they do not forget what they learnt in school.

5. Story

Nabagulanyi Joweria

My name is Nabagulanyi Joweria I am 24 years old. I was born alone, both my parents passed on due to HIV/AIDS when I was 4 years old.

I was left all alone with my Aunt with little hope of going back to school. It was in 2010 when my Aunt (Mrs. Ssebabi Ruth) connected me to Ugandan Lambs Association. It is since then that I gained hope of going back to school. Ever since I joined Ugandan Lambs Association USA it has paid my fees, it has also catered for my other needs (scholastic materials, shoes, uniforms, bed sheets) among others.

Ugandan Lambs Association has educated me right from primary school to higher institution where I have been offering a certificate course in Nursery Teaching at YMCA. I am so grateful to the Almighty that after my studies I was able to get a job as a nursery teacher at Naguru Infant Nursery and Primary school where I am earning 400,000 Ugandan Shillings per month.

I hope that when I stabilize financially, I will be able to support children who are vulnerable just like I was. I am so thankful to my sponsors for having paid the school dues, May the almighty God continue blessing them.
