

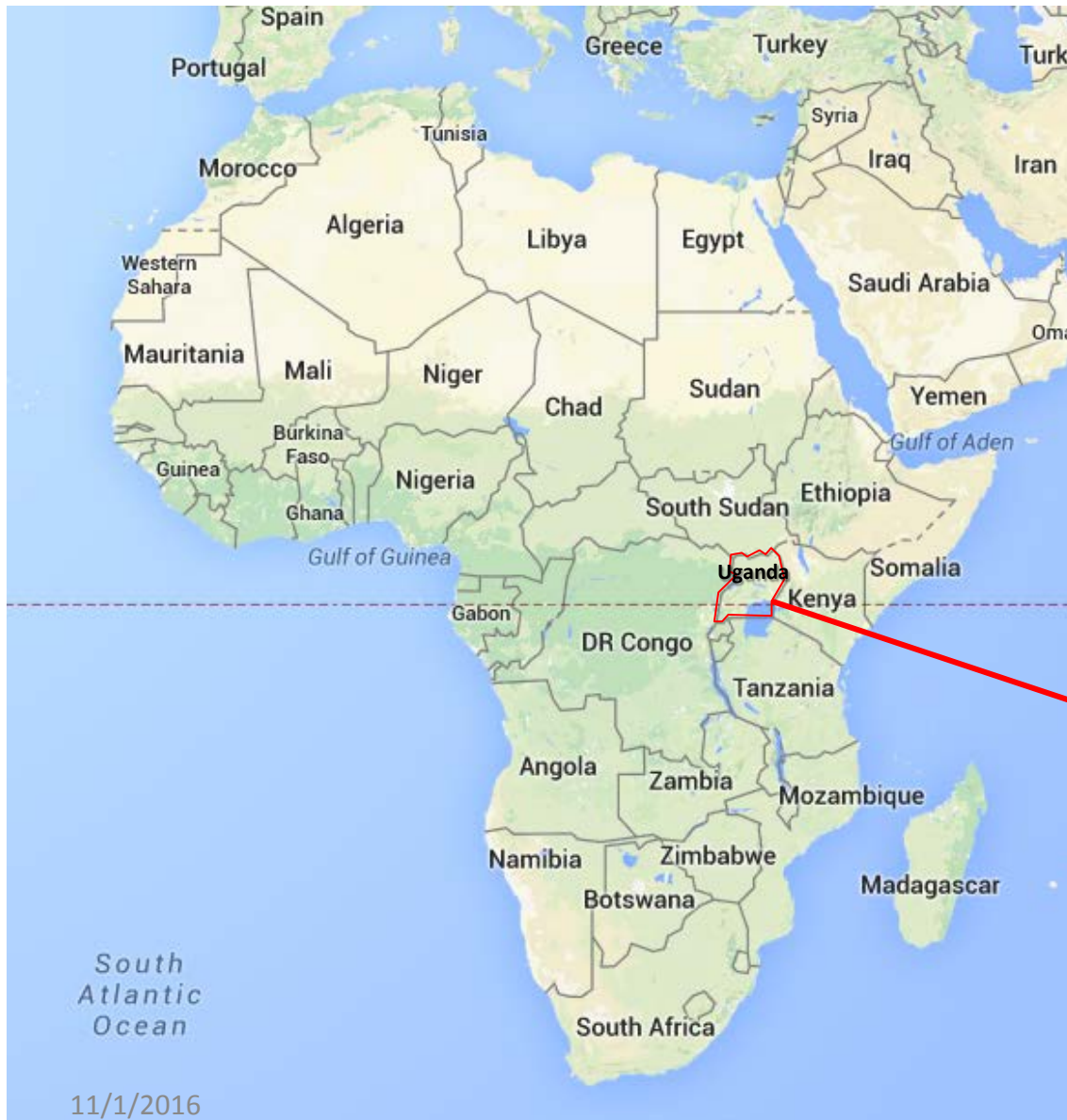

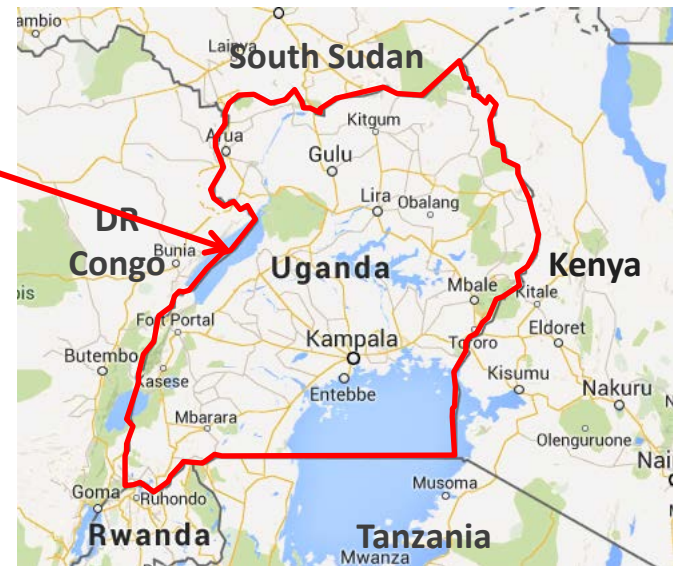

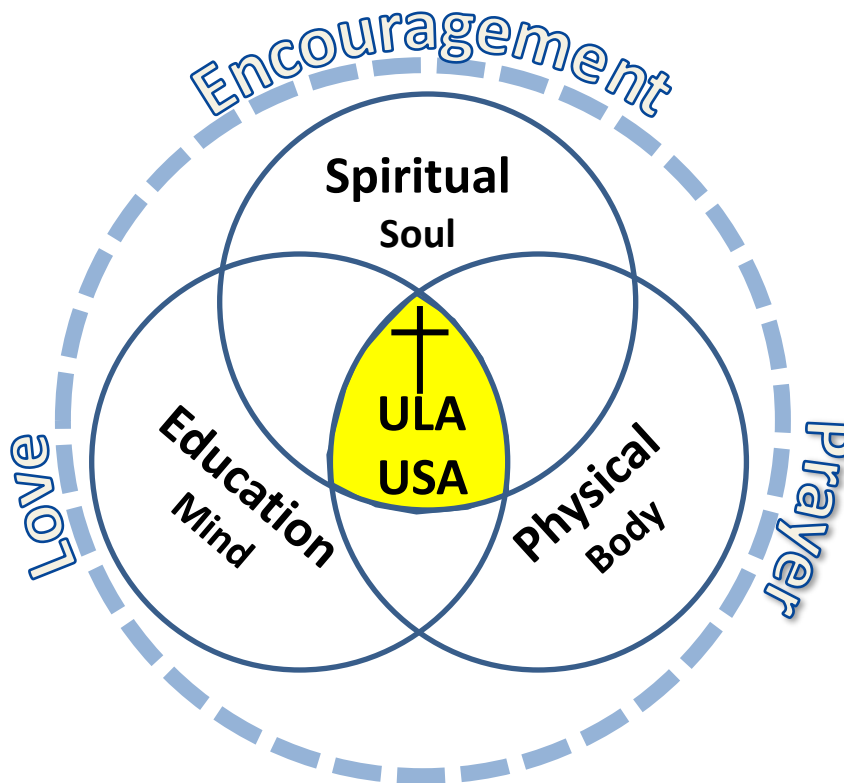
Goal:

Sam and Ruth Sebabi founded Ugandan Lambs Association as a response to the AIDS epidemic impacting both of their families. Over the years, they developed a strong desire to help children unrelated to them as well. As this need continued to grow, additional funds were necessary to continue supporting this growing cause. As a result, Ugandan Lambs Association USA was founded in 2009.

Ugandan Lambs Association (ULAUSA) is officially formed as a nonprofit, the need increases; the Lambs grow to 45

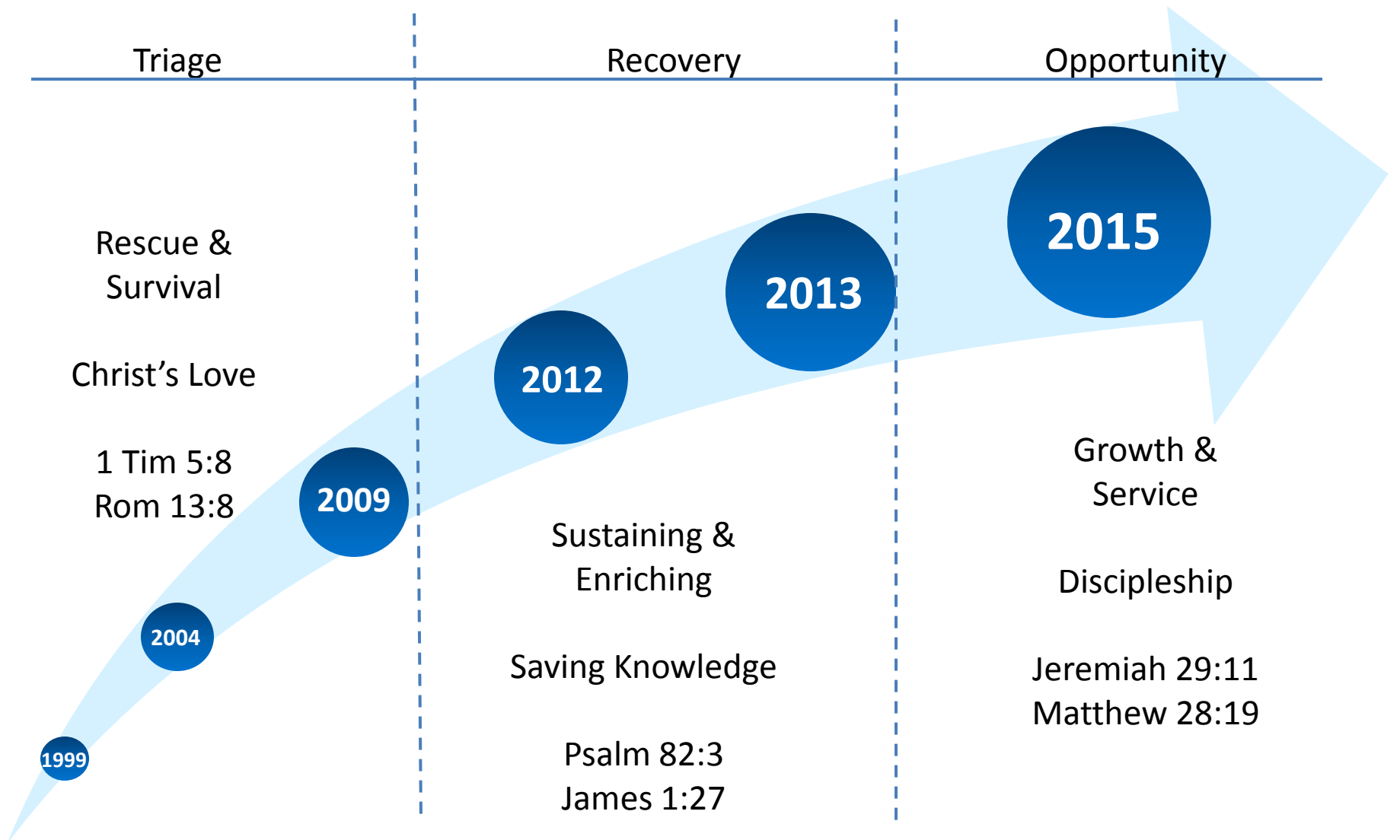

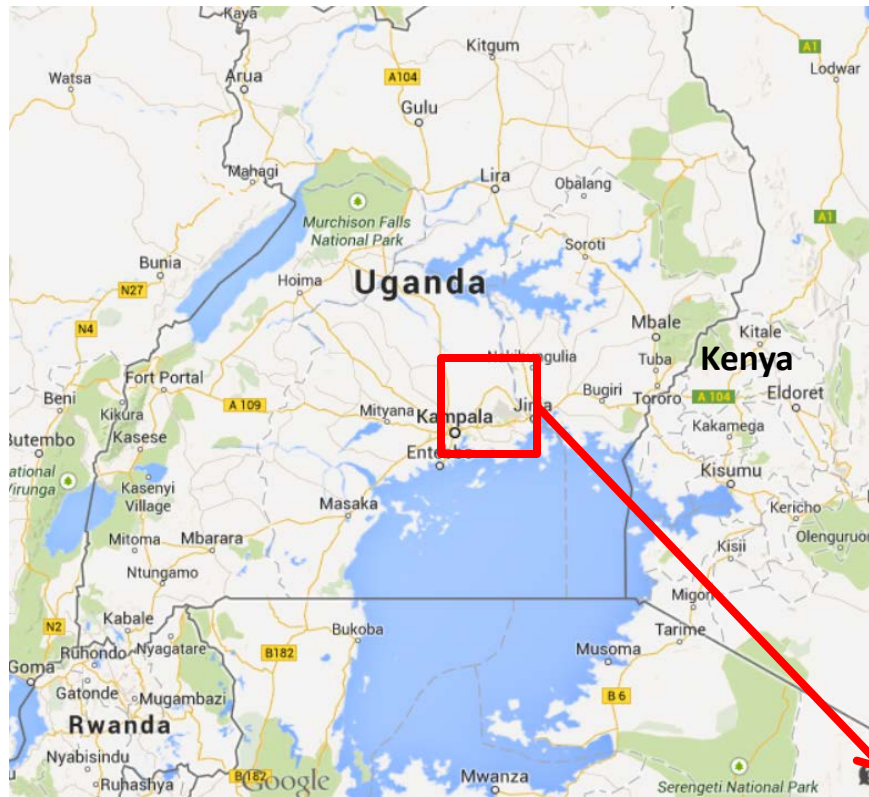

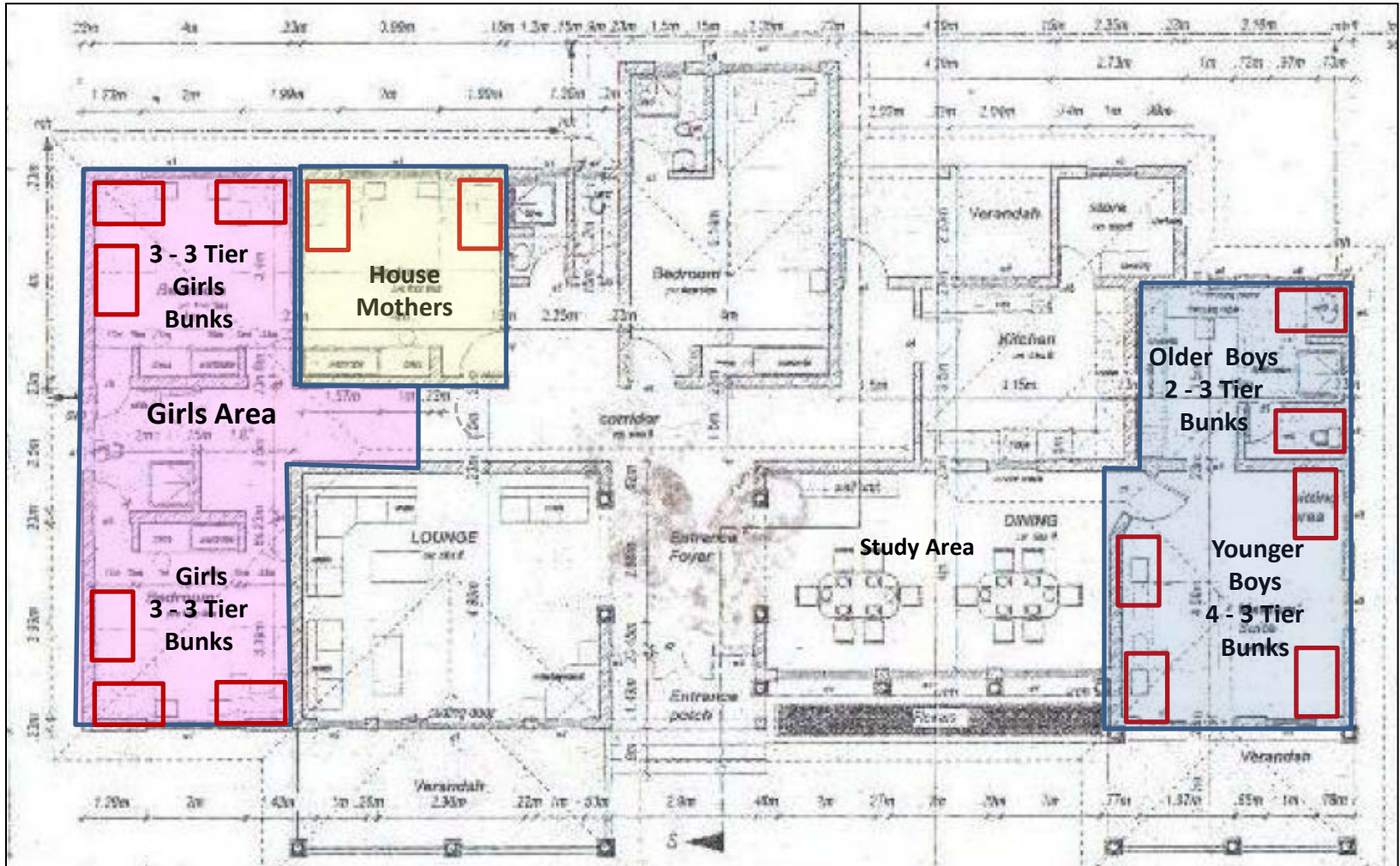

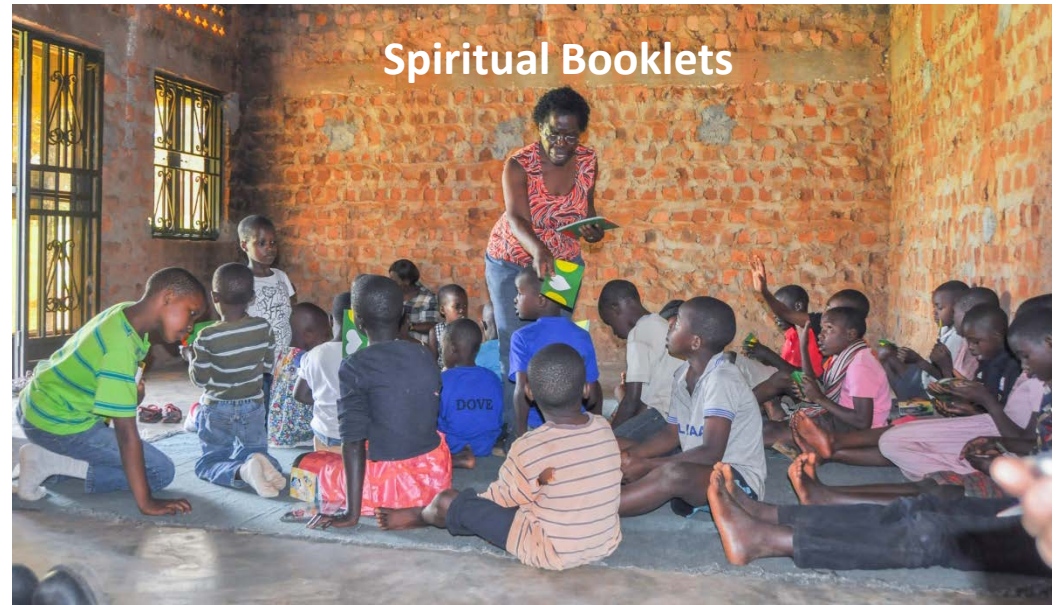
When fully finished Namugongo will comfortably house 36 Children & 2 House Mothers



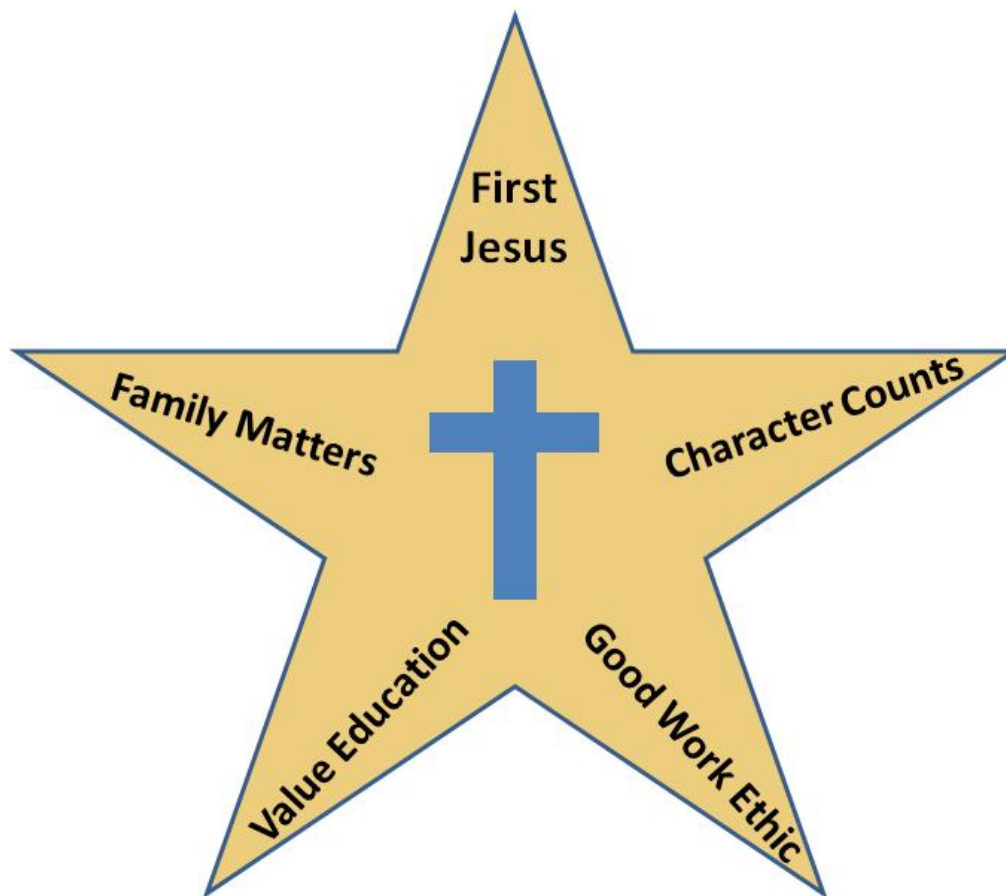

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Generally Healthy Lambs



- Remarkably Healthy

- Some abdominal pain- probably from intestinal parasites
- Occasional Dental Problems
- 3 of 72 children are HIV positive

Volunteer Nurses from the Mission team give annual physicals looking for potential medical issues.

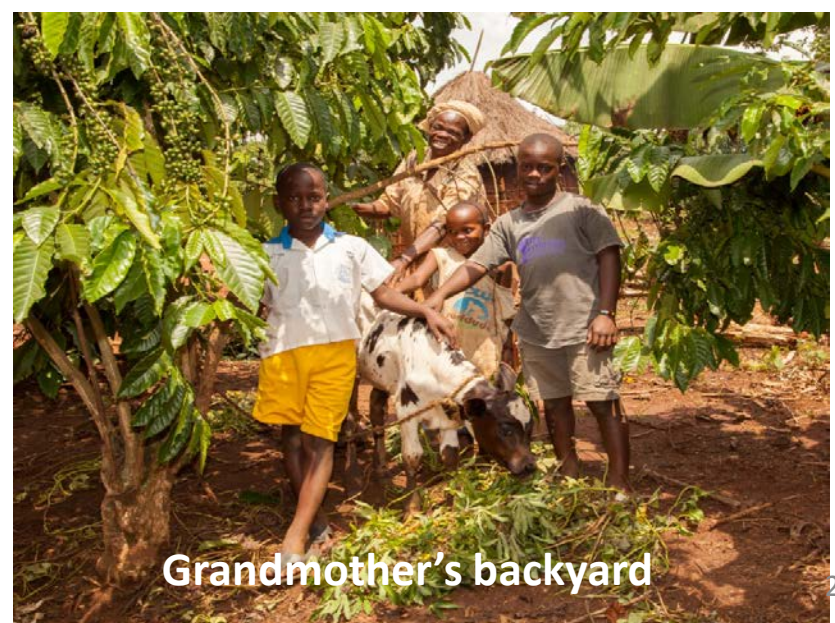

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Ugandan (NCDC) Approved Curriculum



National Curriculum Development Centre (NCDC): Education structure is 7 years of primary, 6 years of secondary , and 3 to 5 years of post-secondary education.

The subjects taught in the NCDC* Curriculum include:

English*

Native Language*

Mathematics*

Social Studies*

Religious Education*- Christian (CRE) or Islamic (IRE)

Integrated Science*

Creative Arts & Physical Education (CAPE)* (Music, Drama, Sports, PE)

Information /Communication & Computers (older children)

Each subject emphasizes the development of contents(subject) competency and relevant language competency.

Students are given a score up to 100 points for each subject. A student who has five subjects in a semester could achieve a total score of 500.

Without Ugandan Lambs



In many villages the best that even non-orphaned children can hope for is a rundown, over-crowded school with little food. 18 % of school-aged children are not enrolled in school; the dropout rate averages 66 %

Food is a major concern. Many do not have enough food to last through the "hungry season" between harvests, and 25% of children under 5 are stunted.

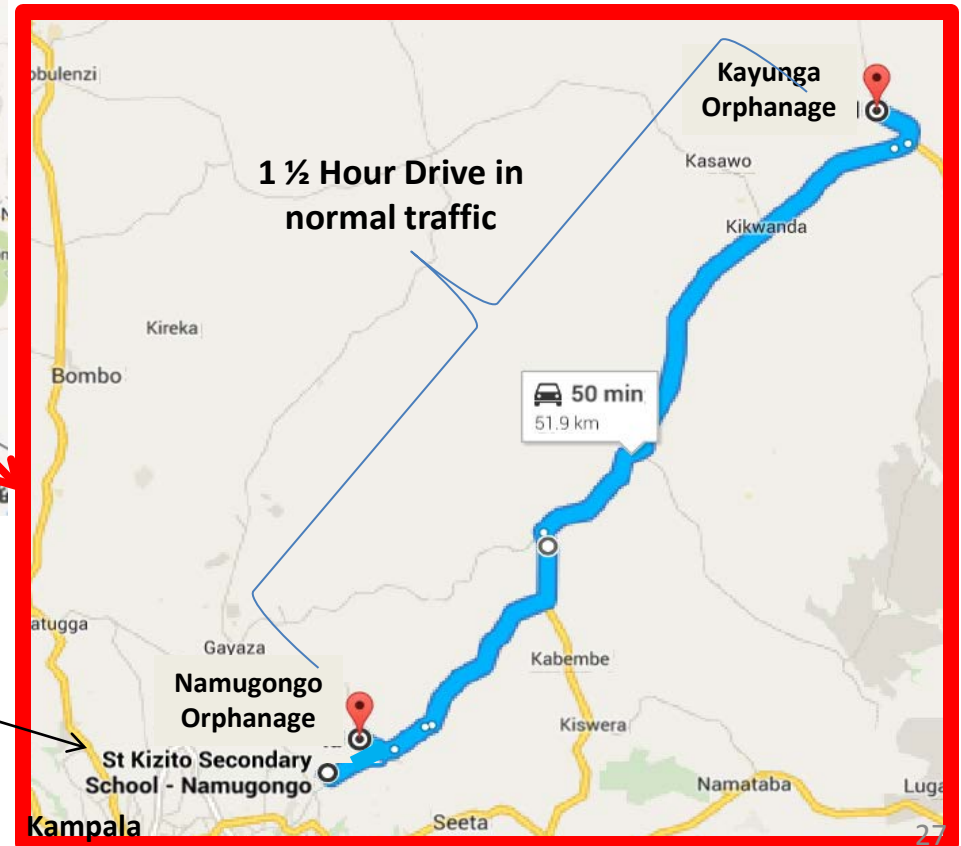
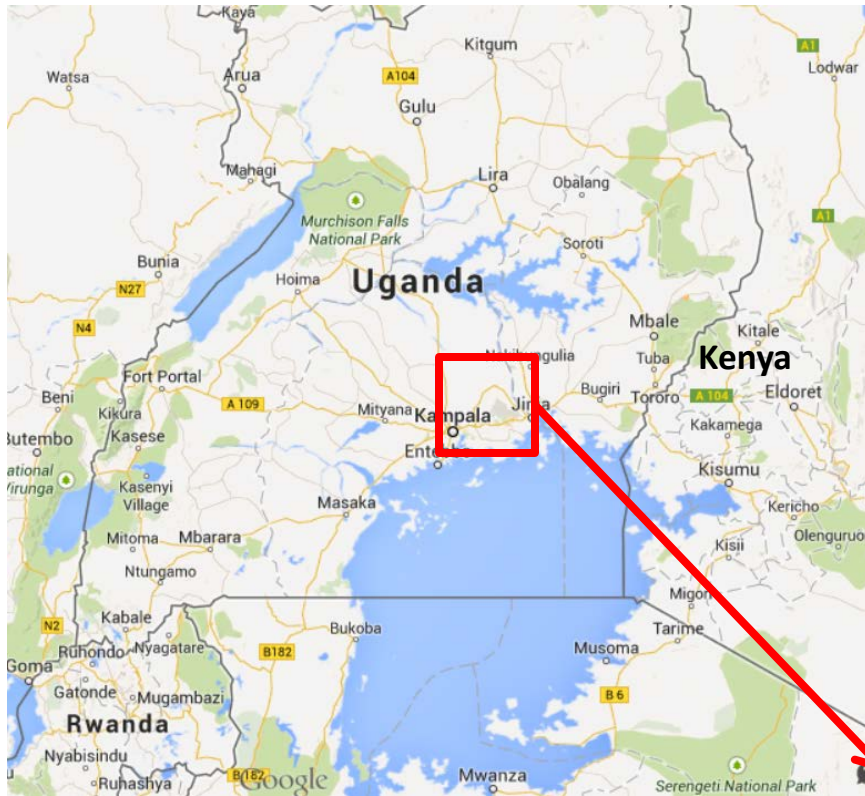
According to the NCDC, these schools typically have little or no:

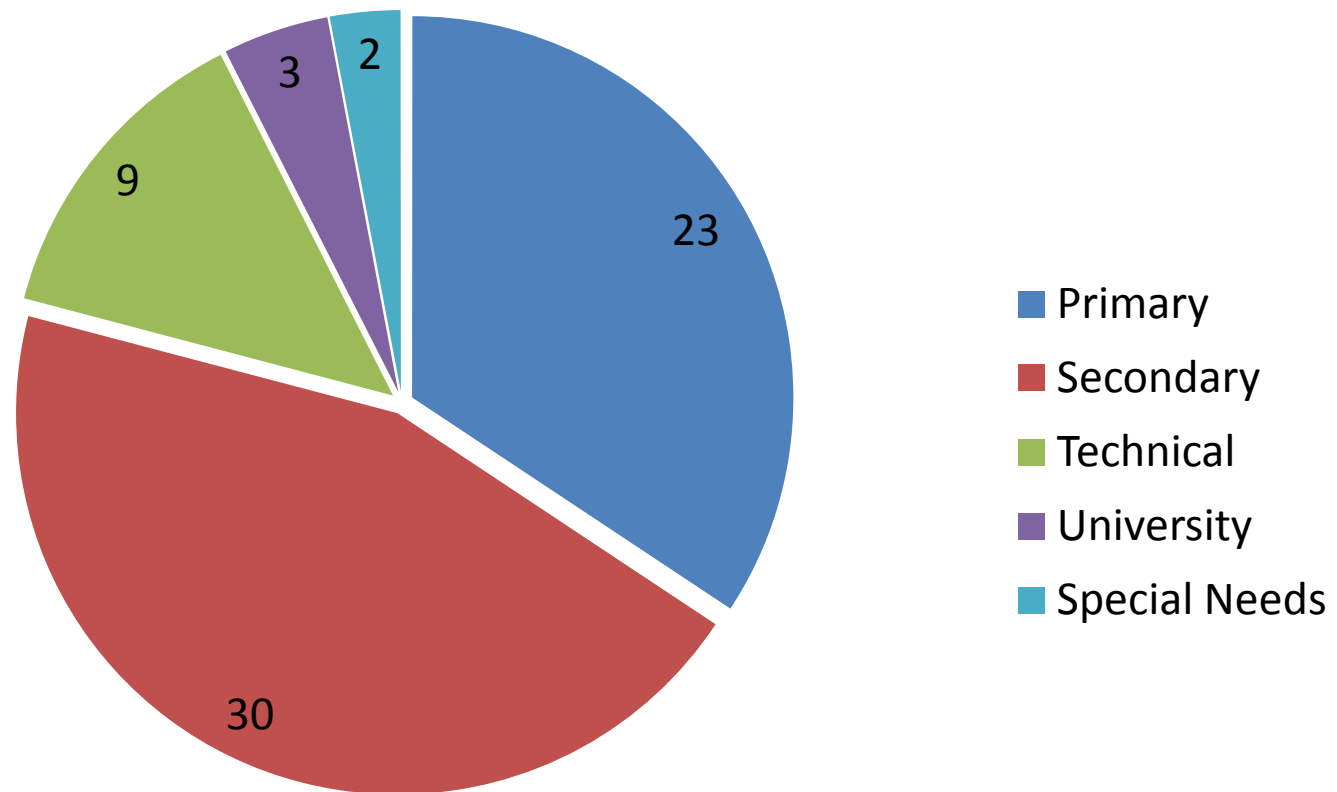

Ugandan Lambs Association USA (ULAUSA) Overview



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Successes Since 2009



- 3 Lambs have graduated from a University (Bachelor of Commerce, Social Work, and Hotel Management)
- Assisted 10 children to graduate from Vocational School, who are gainfully employed in various trades (auto mechanics, plumbing, cosmetology, hotel/restaurant management, brick masonry)
- ULAUSA provided surgery for one child, who then completed high school and qualified for entrance into Medical School in 2013
- Established a relationship with the Mulago Hospital in Kampala, a non-profit providing treatment for our 3 Lambs who are HIV positive
- Increased Ugandan Lambs participation by 28%, to 74 children

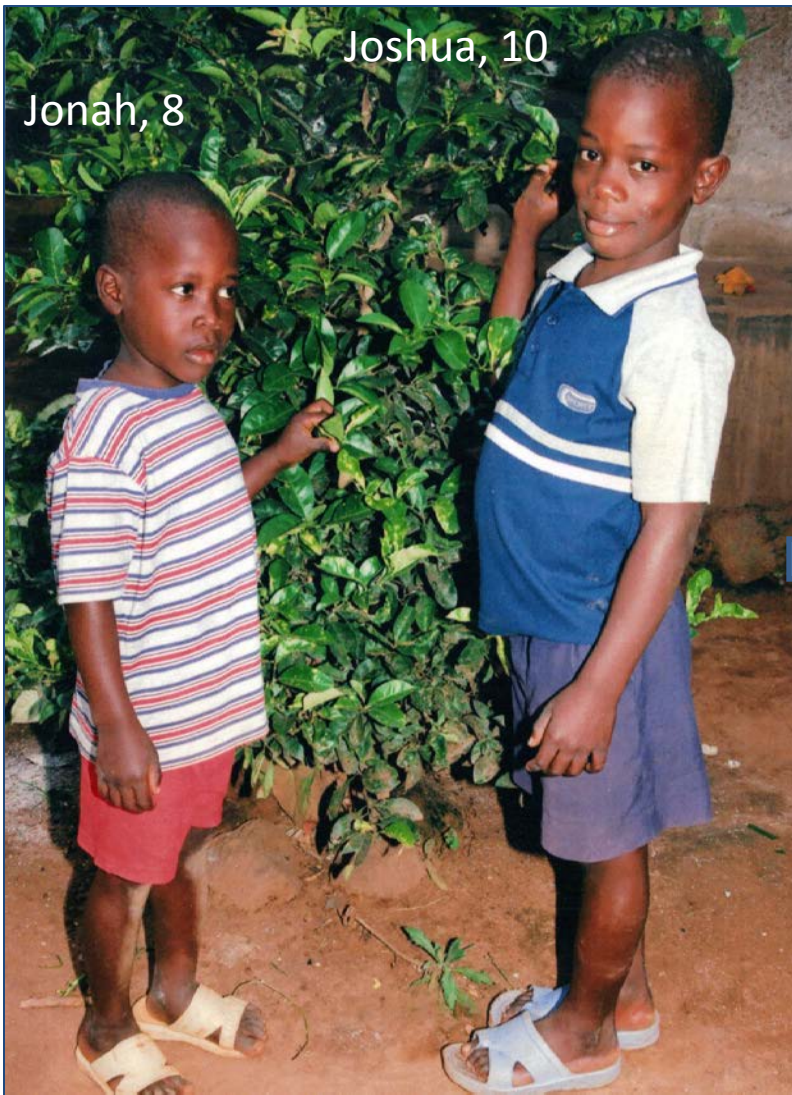
Successes Since 2009

In Uganda many people are competing for a limited number of good jobs, and without a decent education it is very hard to get one or have the confidence to initiate your own business instead. According to the World Bank Uganda has 20% youth unemployment

- 21 Lambs graduate High School 96%
National Average less than 46%
- 13 Lambs in post secondary school 86%
National Average less than 25%
- 10 Lambs gainfully employed
(Youth unemployment rate is near 20%)
- 2 Lambs in Medical/Nursing School

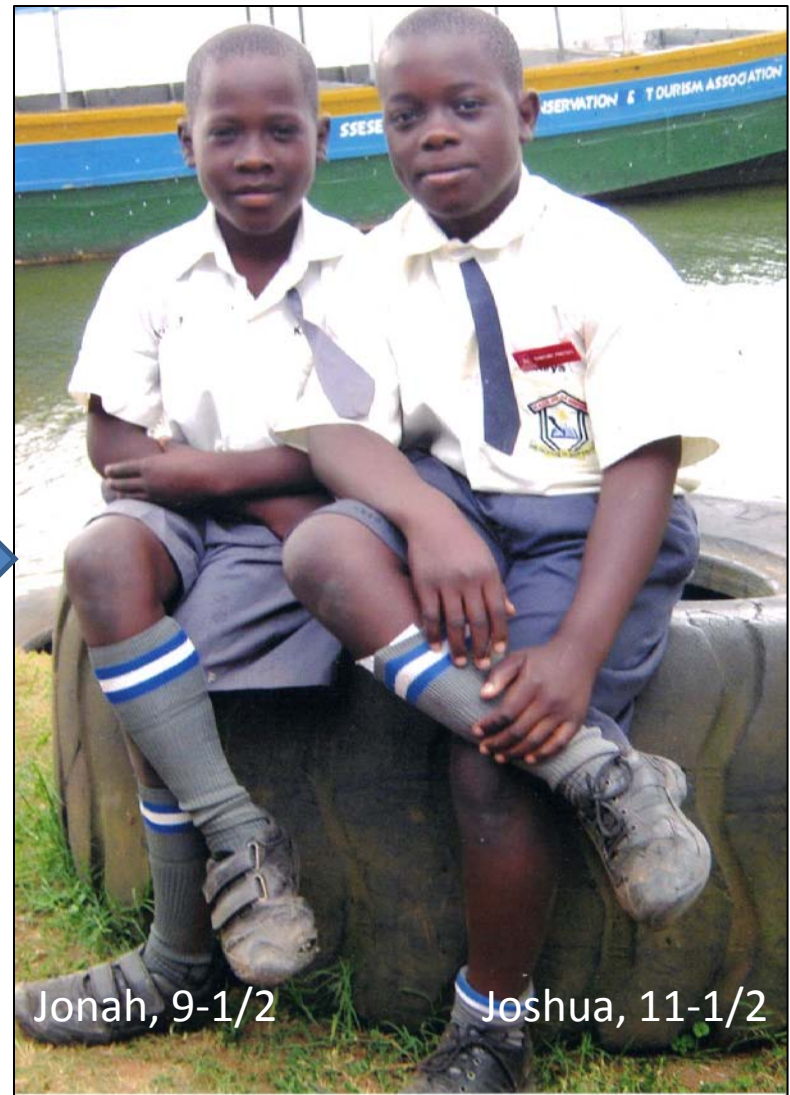

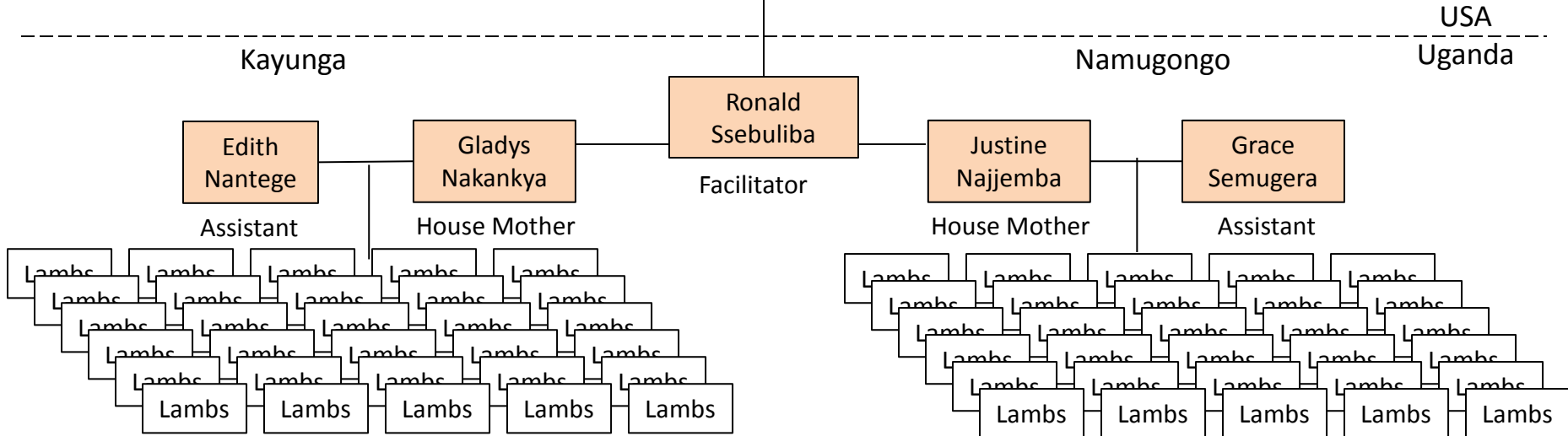

Executive Committee develops the vision, budgets, policies & procedures and presents them to the Board of Directors for approval. The CEO and President are responsible for carrying out the plans.

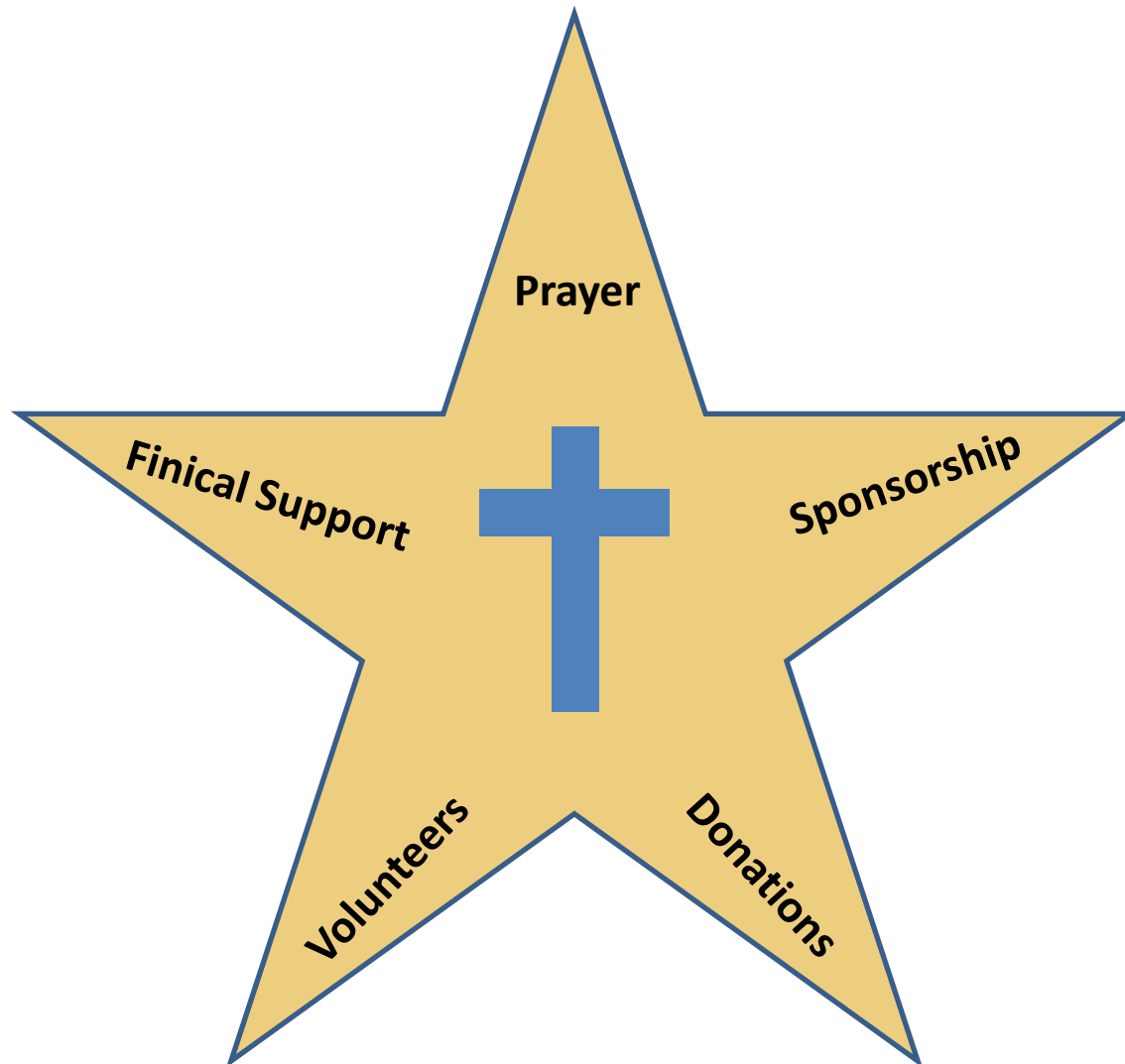
Each committee has a board member as chair for oversight and direction of their respective areas and presents their plans to the board for approval at board meetings.
